 - Your next event...



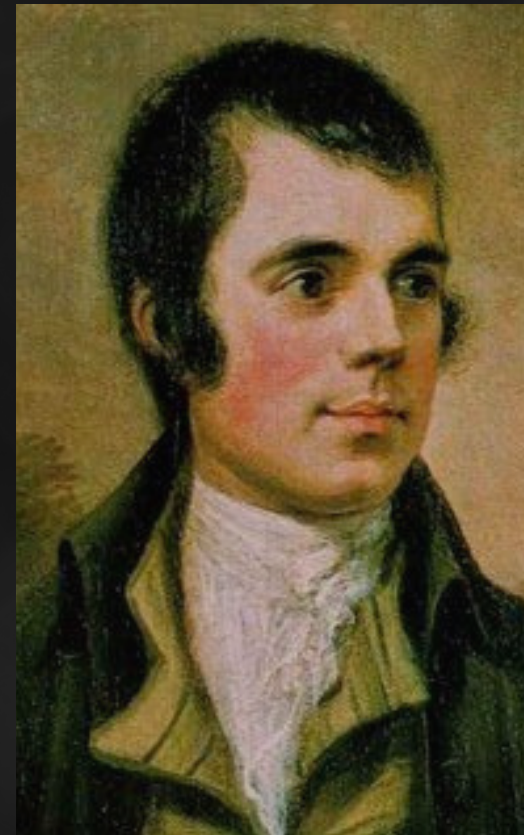
Kilts: One of the most iconic items associated with Scotland, made from traditional tartan fabric. They are much more than something you wear to weddings, ceilidhs or Highland Games - they have stood the test of time.

Bagpipes: The sound of Scotland, whether it is pipers entertaining the locals as they walk down the streets, pipe bands in parades or at weddings and celebrations.



Ceilidhs: Descending from the Gaelic word for 'gathering' or 'party', Ceilidhs were simply local gatherings which developed into a form of literary entertainment with storytelling, recitations and songs. Instrumental music and dancing were added later and the ceilidh as we now know it was born.

Burns Day: 25th January - the day Scot's celebrate Scottish poet Robert Burns with Haggis, Neeps & Tatties and we of course wash this down with a 'wee dram' or two!





Speyside Whisky: This famous region is home to the oldest whisky distillery in Scotland!

Tattie Scone: This potato delight will be found in your Full Scottish Breakfast and is a big fan favourite in Glasgow.

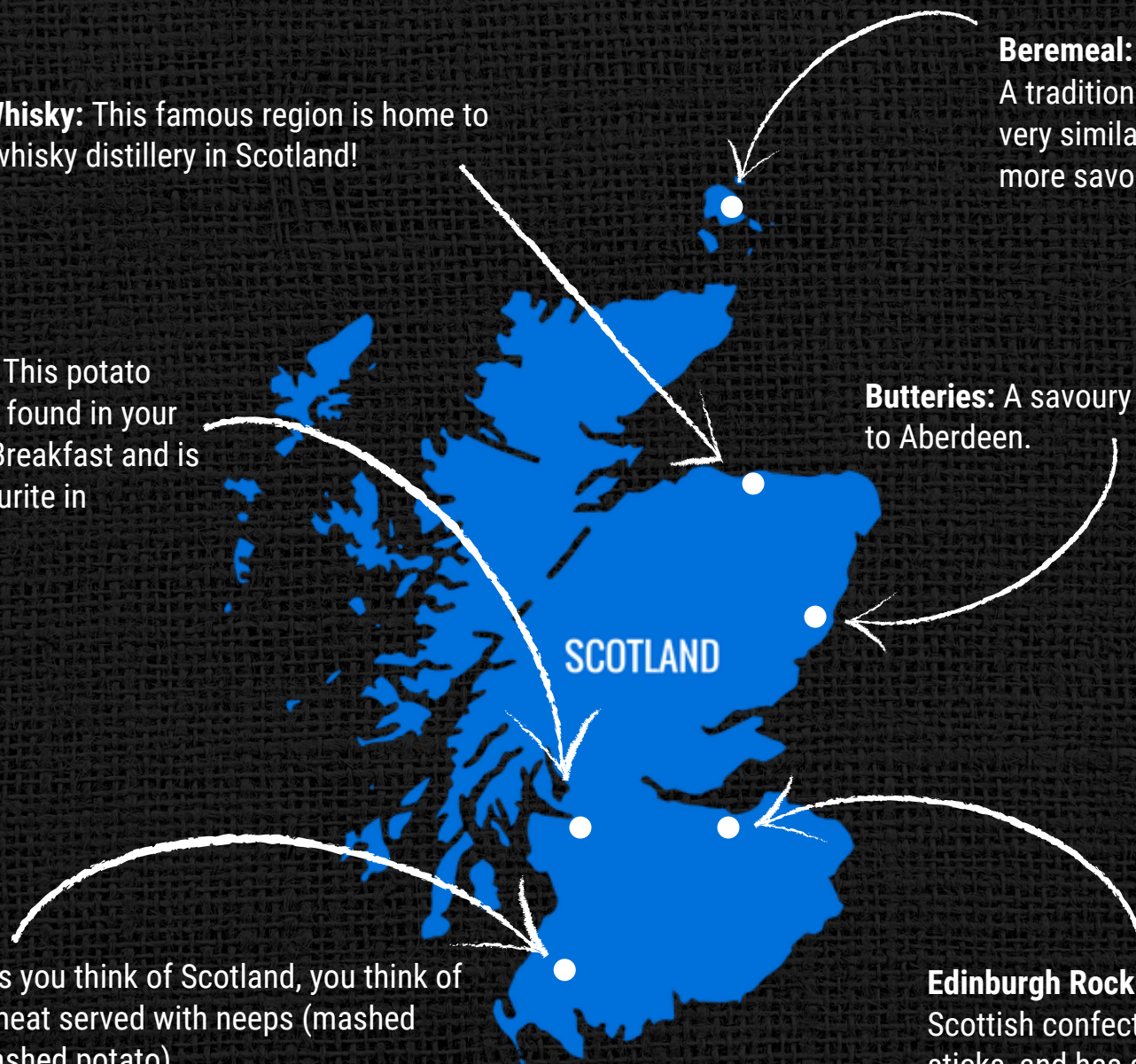
Haggis: As soon as you think of Scotland, you think of this flavoursome meat served with neeps (mashed turnip) & tattie (mashed potato).

Beremeal:

A traditional cereal which is very similar to a scone (but more savoury in taste).

Butteries: A savoury bread roll unique to Aberdeen.

Edinburgh Rock: A traditional Scottish confection formed into sticks, and has a soft and crumbly texture.


Primal Scream: Rock and Roll to the max, this Scottish rock band from Glasgow have been going since the '80s and brought a Scottish twist to Rock and Roll.

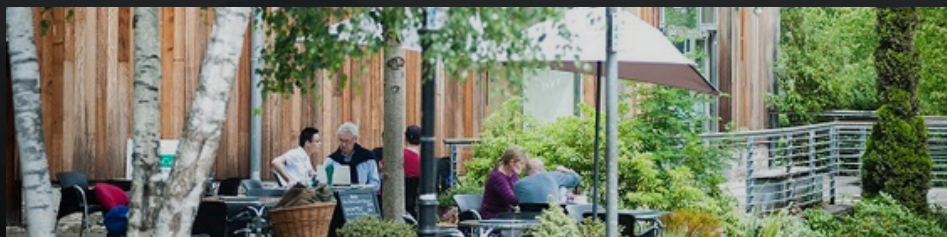

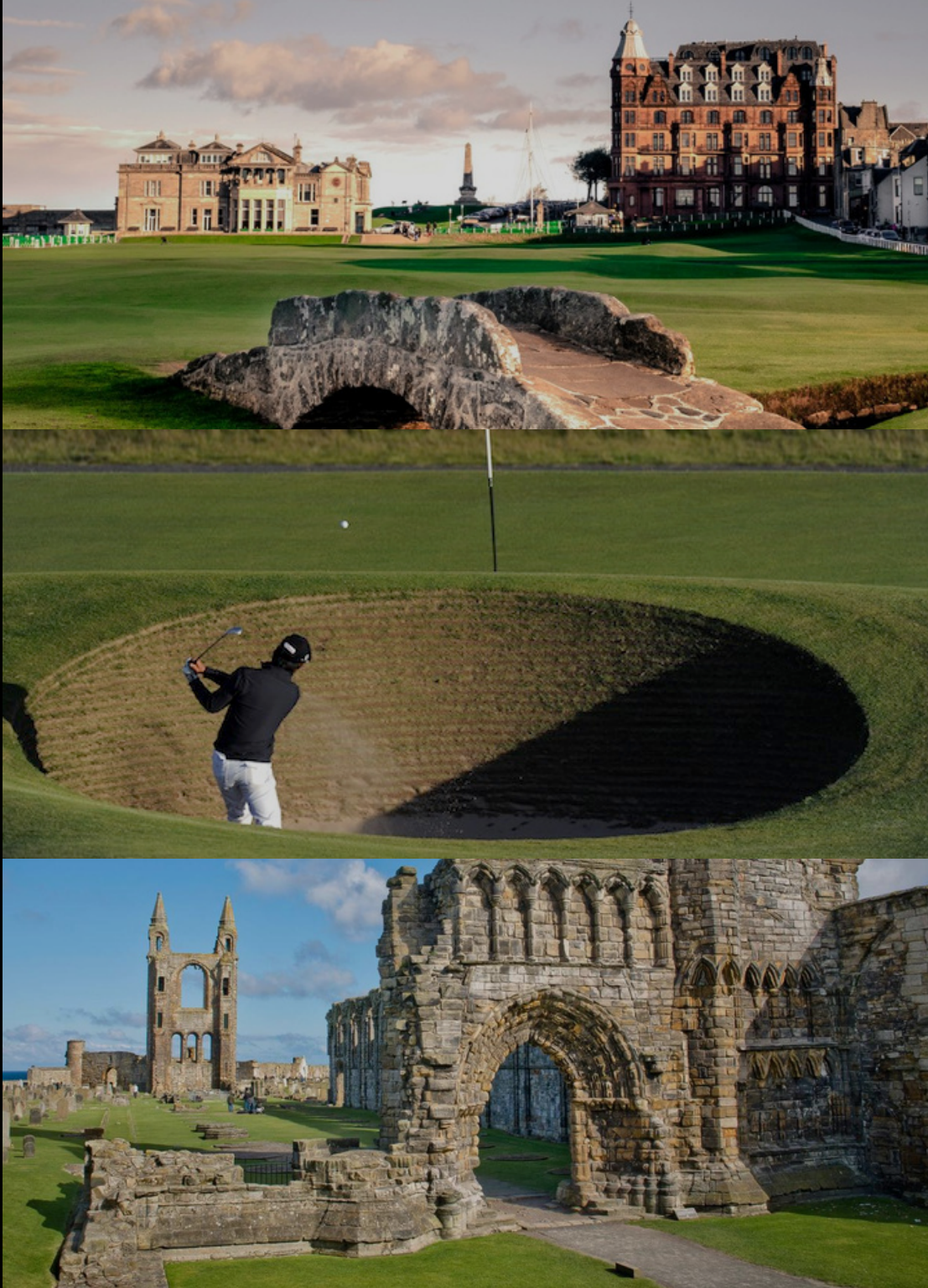
